Why is that a big deal?

Union organizers and pro-union coworkers may tell you that you have to sign an authorization card or fill out a survey to get more information, but that's not true. A union authorization card is a legally-binding document recognized by the U.S. government that gives the union the right to make decisions affecting your pay, benefits, working conditions and more.


THIS MAKES THE UNION AUTHORIZATION CARD LEGALLY BINDING.

Giving the union your HOME AND CELL PHONE NUMBERS allows them to call or text you and intrude on your personal time.

Your HOME ADDRESS allows the union to visit you at home at night and when you are not working.

Obtaining an EMAIL ADDRESS allows virtually constant access.

SIGNING this authorization card gives the union the ability to be your sole representative on things like pay, benefits and working conditions.

REPRESENTATION PETITION

USW is authorized to use my name to achieve recognition of the Union. This exercise of my rights is a public commitment which will be made known to my fellow employees, my employer and the National Labor Relations Board.
